Group 2 – Pruning is moderate or optional. Even though some cultivars can flower on new growth, these Clematis usually produce the largest flowers on older vines from prior years. In early spring, prune to remove ends that are damaged or showing no signs of new growth. Use caution to retain stems from last season for best flowering. Group 2 Clematis are repeat bloomers that bloom in late spring/early summer and then sporadically throughout the summer and fall.

‘Asao’ Z. 4-10 6-8” pale, rosy carmine pink flowers. Blooms May-June, September. 6-9’. Shade tolerant.



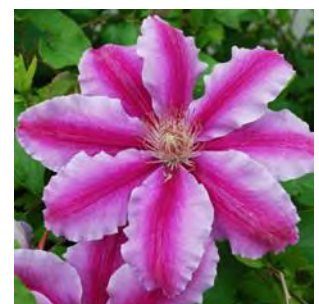
‘Bees Jubilee’ Z. 4-8 8" mauve-pink flower with carmine bar. Blooms May-June, September. 6-10’ tall.



‘Countess of Lovelace’ Z. 4-9 6-8” lilac flowers Bloom as double blossoms in May and June and as single in August. 6-9’ tall.



‘Dr. Ruppel’ Z. 4-8 6-8" rose red with carmine bar flowers in May, June and September. Grows 6-10' tall.



‘Gillian Blades’

7-9" pure white blooms with frilled edges. Blooms May-June, Sept. 6-8' tall.



‘Guernsey Cream’

6-8" creamy white blooms. May-June, August. 6-9' tall.



‘Haku Ookan’

Z. 4-8

Dark violet pointed petals with large white stamens. Blooms as a double flower in spring and a single in fall. Grows 6-9'.



‘Nelly Moser’

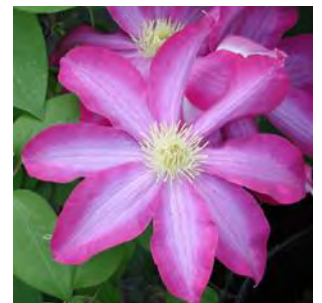
Over 100 years in production and still one of the most popular varieties. 7-9" pale mauve pink with carmine bar flowers in May, June, and September. Grows 6-9' tall.



‘Pink Champagne’

6-8" purple-pink flowers with light pink central bar. Blooms May-June, September. 6-9' tall.



‘Princess Kate’

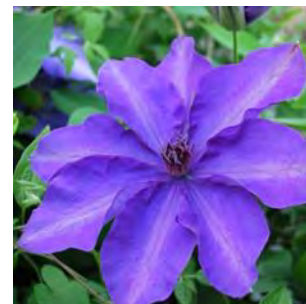
Upward, trumpet shaped white flowers with scarlet throats. Blooms summer and into autumn. Grows 5-9' tall.



‘The President

A favorite for more than a century, ‘The President’ develops classic 6-8” purple-blue flowers from June to September. 8-12’. Blooms simultaneously on new and old wood.



Group 3 – Prune hard. These Clematis are vigorous and bloom primarily on new vines. They bloom in late summer or early fall. Prune the plants every spring down to just above the lowest node showing growth. Large, established plants can also be pruned flat to the soil, which helps initiate new stems.

‘Comtess de Bouchard’

Tried and true pink summer-bloomer. Flowers June-Sept 4-6” pink flowers on 8-12’ vine. Blooms on new wood, so prune hard to encourage flowering.



‘Jackmanii’

One of the best known clematis. Easy-to-grow variety. 4-6” deep purple blossoms in June-September. 12-20’ tall.



‘Madame Julia Correvon’

Z. 3-9

Deep, wine-red sepals from June-September on 8-14’ vines. Easy-to-grow and a profuse bloomer over a long season.



***C. integrifolia* ‘Mongolian Bells’**

Z. 3-9

Mounding, herbaceous clematis, with small, bell-shaped blooms in a mix of pink, white, lavender, and blue. Excellent in the xeriscape. Blooms spring-summer. 10-16” tall.



C. paniculata

Z. 4-9

(Sweet Autumn Clematis) The 1-2” scented flowers and produced in September and October. Grows 20 to 30’ tall.



‘Niobe’

Z. 4-9

Very dark ruby-red 4-6” flowers with yellow stamens. The compact 6-8’ plants flower from June to September.



‘Rhapsody’

Z. 3-9

4-6” blue-violet flowers on 6-8’ vine blooms June to September. Flowers profusely.



‘Rouge (red) Cardinal’

Z. 4-9

Glowing burgundy-crimson with brown stamens. 4-6” blooms from June to September. Mature height 8-12’.
